Adult Sunday School meets Sundays at 9:15am in the parlor. Next Sunday, January 26th we will discuss Luke 5:1-11, in which Jesus calls fishermen to fish for people. Every lesson is stand alone. Join us!

Epiphanies: Recognizing God in our world. Our winter Bible Study, held at 2:15pm and 6pm on Tuesdays in Thomas Hall continues through March 4th. Epiphanies are moments when the ordinary becomes extraordinary, when God's presence is revealed or recognized in a tangible way.
